Dog Licensing Is Important

Obtaining a Dog License

If your dog has never been licensed, you must:

- Provide a certificate from your veterinarian showing when the rabies shot was given.
- Provide a certificate from your veterinarian showing when the rabies shot expires.
- License your puppy as soon as it receives its first rabies shot.
- Immediately license all dogs moving into the City of Newark.

Unlicensed dogs will be ticketed by the Animal Control Officer.

Dog licenses cost \$11.20 for male or female dogs, and \$8.20 for spayed or neutered dogs.

All dogs must be licensed by January 1st each year. You may renew your dog's license in person at Newark City Hall Permits and License (Room B-17).

If your dog is unlicensed you can be cited and fined. We are working to protect your public health and the safety of your dog. Licensing your dog provides it with identification and protects your dog from theft. You really can't afford not to license your dog. We are doing all we can to protect your dog from harm, but we can't do it alone.
